Completion of purchase of Coed y Parc dam and woods

The transfer of ownership of the Coed y Parc dam, lower Parc yr Ocar and Parc yr Ynys was completed on Wednesday 28th April.

General meeting

The next General meeting will be held at 7 pm on Tuesday the 1st of June at the Memorial Hall.

Displays

Insurance

The delays in the purchase were generated by the difficulties we experienced obtaining insurance for the dam. After trying 12 different brokers for a while it seemed that the only insurers were Zurich who, after a six month delay gave us a quote of £2,600 per year for public liability insurance. This was obviously much more than we could afford. Fortunately the difficulties of insuring public access land has been recognised by Rural Arbor Products Ltd and they have put together a package of insurance to cover Woodland Owner's Public Liability. This is underwritten by ACE Europe Insurance and is a block policy running from the 1 July to 20 June for a premium of £53 per wood. After learning of the condition and size of the dam. Rural Arbor Products have offered us insurance for £38 to cover the period 30 April to 30 June.

Management plan

Many thanks to everyone who came to meetings and contributed to the management plan. We had over 35 people contribute ideas and support to the management plan – we have been told that this is a very high level of involvement given that we have 105 members.

Evelyn Over, our woodland agent, has completed the draft management plan. The draft plan will be presented at the next General meeting for wider consultation.

The plan makes provision for up to £1000 from the Forestry Commission towards fencing, footpath improvements etc.. The details will be in the plan of operations attached to the management plan. We hope to be able to start work as soon as the management plan is formally adopted.

First Hydro

Parc yr Ynys does not have sufficient trees to be considered woodland by the Forestry Commission and therefore is not covered by the FC grants. We therefore made an application to First Hydro for help with this area of land and they have offered us £600 towards the materials (fencing etc.) required for Parc yr Ynys.

Forest Education Initiative

The FEI is run by the FC to support the development of educational use of woodlands.

We will be meeting with local FEI staff at Ysgol Bodfeurig on the 18th May to discuss ideas for involving the school in Parc yr Bwlch. Initial ideas are to have the school children make a bench from trees from Parc yr Bwlch and to look at the feasibility of establishing a Forest School in Parc yr Bwlch.

We should have a better idea of what is possible by the General meeting.

John Muir Trust

The John Muir Award is an environmental award scheme focused on wild places. It encourages the discovery and conservation of

wild places for all ages through various activities and projects. One idea is that the woods and other wild areas close to Mynydd Llandygai could be used by anyone (particularly children and teenagers) wishing to participate in the John Muir Award challenges. To take this forward we need people to act as leaders. The JMT run two-day leader training courses (which Coetir Mynydd can pay for) throughout the year with the next course in Wales being on the 13-14th November 2004.

Parc y Bwlch management plan

The Board has met with Kim Burnham who is the FC officer in charge of Parc y Bwlch. Under the Woodlands for Wales strategy the FC are obliged to involve local communities as far as possible in management of Welsh Assembly woodlands. Kim is happy to work with Coetir Mynydd on generating ideas for the social aspects of the Parc yr Bwlch management plan. We intend to initiate gathering ideas for Parc y Bwlch at the General meeting. In the meantime, if you have any contributions you can send them to Jenny.

Cydcoed

We have registered an interest in applying for a Cydcoed grant for woodland management in Mynydd Llandygai but have yet to establish quite what we will ask for, as the FC will do most of what is required in Parc yr Ocar. Cydcoed can 100% fund suitable projects and can help purchase land. They are particularly keen to establish new community woodland and to provide disabled access. We need to poll ideas on what we might do with this opportunity.
